4,312 customized safety plans were created last year. Safety plans are developed to reflect the needs of each survivors' situation. It could be leaving the safe walls of the shelter, starting a new job, the first time dropping the kids off, or even planning to safely to get away from their abuser in the first place. Through all of our programs we are continually safety planning with survivors as they navigate each step.
